As a global society whose mission is to advance the science of reproduction, fertility, and development for the benefit of humans and animals, the SSR welcomes proposals from all countries and on all reproduction-related subject areas. The SSR plans to fund ~8 one-year grant awards of up to \$10,000. Applications will be submitted electronically via grant application form.

Proposals are due on April 26, 2024 by 5:00 PM EDT.

Grant award notifications will be made by July 15, 2024 and funding will be dispersed by September 1, 2024.

Member Volunteers Requested: Participate as Mentors at the Trainee-Mentor Luncheon




