The SSR plans to fund ~8 one-year grant awards of up to \$10,000. Applications will be submitted electronically via grant application form.

Proposals are due on April 26, 2024 by 5:00 PM EDT.

Grant award notifications will be made by July 15, 2024 and funding will be dispersed by September 1, 2024.

In Memoriam

It is with deep sorrow that SSR has recently learned that William (Bill) Kinsey passed away on March 23, 2024.

Dr. Kinsey was a professor of Cell Biology and Physiology at the University of Kansas Medical Center. He graduated from the University of Alabama, received a PhD in molecular biology from the University of Washington and conducted postdoctoral research at Johns Hopkins, prior to taking a faculty position at the University of Miami. In 1991, Bill joined the KU faculty as an associate professor of Anatomy and Cell Biology. Bill was both an accomplished researcher and popular educator. His research dealt with the fascinating question of why the egg accepts only a single sperm during fertilization, a well-accepted but a highly enigmatic selection process. His most recent findings point to a under appreciated structural organizational of the actin layer underlying the oolema and its role in the fertilization process. As an educator, Bill taught generations of medical and graduate students in topics ranging from reproductive physiology to gross anatomy. He also directed a postdoctoral training program funded by the NIH and mentored younger investigators as Co-Director of the Center for Reproductive Science.

His obituary and memorial can be found on the SSR Memorials <u>page</u>. His memorial service will be held on Friday, April 5, 2024 from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM at the Langsford Funeral Home in Lee's Summit, MO.

SSR extends condolences to Bill's family, friends, and colleagues.


Member Volunteers Needed



Applying a novel kinomics approach to study decidualization and the effects of antigestagens using a canine model. Isabelle De Geyter et al.

Serine/threonine kinases in canine uterine stromal cells increase during decidualization but are disrupted by P4/PGR signaling interference; PKA and PKC have distinct effects on decidualized cells' function.
