Anita Hart Payne, reproductive endocrinologist and university professor, died on Sunday, February 15, in Palo Alto, California, at age 82. Anita was born in Karlsruhe, Germany, and came to San Francisco with her parents and sister Dorothy in 1938. She received her B.A. and Ph.D. in Physiology from the University of California, Berkeley. She was a faculty member in the Departments of Obstetrics and Gynecology and Biological Chemistry at the University of Michigan from 1971-1995 and a Senior Research Scientist at Stanford University from 1995-2007. Over her long and distinguished scientific career she took pride in serving as a role model and mentor, especially for women scientists. She was married to Francis (Gene) Payne for 31 years until his untimely death. She is survived by her son Greg, daughter-in-law Dara, grandchildren Isaac, Gretel, and Jabe, and her daughter Teresa Lyons, son-in-law Ron, and grandson Matthew. She is also survived by her sister Dorothy Levy and family. She was predeceased by her youngest daughter Janet. Anita will be held in loving memory by her family and many friends.
