We are proud to congratulate SSR members **Asgi Fazlebaes** and **Linda Guidice** who have been awarded prestigious funding opportunities from the Office of Research for Women's Health (ORWH) at NIH. The awards, Understanding Chronic Conditions Understudied Among Women, called for innovative research addressing chronic conditions affecting women and individuals assigned female at birth.

Their work will focus on advancing our understanding of understudied chronic conditions among women, particularly those that disproportionately impact populations traditionally underrepresented and underreported in biomedical research. This is a significant step toward improving health outcomes for women in underserved communities.

Closing Friday: Open Comment Period for the Proposed Revisions to the SSR Bylaws

The changes were presented to the attendees at the 2024 Annual Business Meeting and are available for review on the SSR website. We encourage you to take a moment to review the changes and submit any comments or suggestions. Following the member comment period, the Bylaws Committee will assess comments received for further proposed revisions, and if required, for Board approval. The revised bylaws will then be circulated to SSR Regular Members for a vote in December 2024.
