The deadline to submit an abstract is Saturday, February 15, 2025.

The deadline will NOT be extended.

ReproSymposium Survey

The Public Affairs Committee (PAC) is excited to announce plans for a Virtual Summer ReproSymposium aimed at increasing our outreach efforts. This symposium is designed for summer students working in SSR member labs, including undergraduate and possibly high school students. It will provide an opportunity to establish a new and exciting virtual symposium geared to the next generation of reproductive biologists (those that have yet to commit to graduate studies), and an opportunity for labs that may be physically isolated from other Repro labs to form a virtual community to share ideas and research. The plan is to feature 4-6 virtual meetings between June 2 – August 8, 2025, each lasting one hour (1 p.m.EST/10 a.m. PST, day TBD). Volunteers from SSR member labs, including PIs and trainees, will present10–15-minute

talks (2–3 per session) followed by Q&A. In the final meeting, summer student volunteers will have the opportunity to present flash talks or posters and win exciting awards (TBD).

The Roger V. Short Lectureship took place on Thursday, January 29, 2025, featuring award recipient Francesca E. Duncan, PhD, Associate Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine. Dr. Duncan delivered an informative and engaging lecture on "A Decade of Discovery:

Ovarian Aging: From Mechanisms to Clinical Translation" to an audience of over 350 attendees, both in person and virtually.

Presented by SSR, SRB and SRF the Roger V. Short Medal and Lectureship is a prestigious international award recognizing early-career researchers who embody the same spirit of discovery, creativity, and imagination as Roger V. Short. This honor is awarded to individuals making outstanding contributions to the field of reproductive science.
