SSR Annual Meeting Child Caregiving Grant

SSR's Women in Reproductive Science, Diversity, and Trainee Affairs committees have developed a small grants program for SSR Members with young children to help offset the costs of childcare during the annual meeting.

At a time in your career when attending meetings can be most beneficial, early-career scientists often struggle to balance family care needs, budgets, and care logistics. In response to these challenges, SSR is offering grants to help partially offset childcare costs to attend the annual meeting in Washington, D.C.. The SSR will be providing up to ten grants of \$500 per family.

SSR Emerging Investigator Grant

These grant awards support early-stage investigators with seed grants that generate valuable preliminary data. As a global society whose mission is to advance the science of reproduction, fertility, and development for the benefit of humans and animals, the SSR welcomes proposals from all countries and on all reproduction-related subject areas.

Proposals that do not follow submission guidelines will not be considered for funding.

Extra Trainee Travel Grants

To mitigate the impact of recent Federal Agency Decisions on budgets and travel restrictions, the SSR Board will be adding additional Trainee Travel Grants to assist with expenses.

- Award amount is \$500/grant award/per attendee for up to 40 recipients.
- **Applications will be accepted until June 15, 2025**; however, priority will be given to trainees and applicants supplying evidence of financial hardship.
- All funds awarded above will be issued in the form of a check or ACH. Payments will be distributed at the conclusion of the meeting once attendance is verified.

Trainee Merit Travel Award for Abstract Submissions

The Society for Study of Reproduction Trainee Travel Awards (SSR-TTA) were established to support the participation of Trainee members at the annual meetings.

SSR will contribute up to \$500 to support each of 20 Trainee members enrolled in the Continental North America (the United States and Canada) and up to \$1000 to support each of 5 international (non-North American) enrolled Trainee members as a contribution towards the costs of conference registration, travel, and accommodation. Applicants will be judged on abstract quality and volunteer service to the scientific community.
