

# **BOR EDITOR'S CHOICE**




The downregulation of FKBP5 contributes to the pathogenesis of adenomyosis and is associated with impaired endometrial receptivity.


Meng Wang et al find FKBP5 is downregulated in patients with adenomyosis, contributing to impaired endometrial stromal cell function and disrupted decidualization, suggesting its potential as a therapeutic target for adenomyosis treatment.

The nuclear transport factor IPO5 was revealed as a critical mediator of male germline development


Findings from Julia Young et al found that the nuclear transport protein importin 5 (IPO5) is essential for embryogenesis and for male germ cells at multiple ages. Of the novel IPO5 potential binding partners identified in this study, many are required for spermatogenesis.


